Scales (70 bpm)

Candidates must play each scale **once**. Candidates must use each starting note **at least once**: E, A and G

- 1. Major
- 2. Minor pentatonic
- 3. Natural minor
- 4. Major pentatonic

(4 scales in total)

Group B

Arpeggio (70 bpm)

Candidates must play both arpeggio types listed, and from each of the three starting notes E, A and G

- 1. Major arpeggio
- 2. Minor arpeggio

(6 arpeggios in total)

GRADE 2

Group A

Scales (80 bpm)

Candidates must play each scale **once**. Candidates must use each starting note **at least once**: A, G and C

- 1. Major
- 2. Natural minor
- 3. Minor pentatonic
- 4. Major pentatonic

Group B

Arpeggio (80 bpm)

Candidates must play both arpeggio types listed, and from each of the three starting notes A, G and C

- 1. Major arpeggio
- 2. Minor arpeggio

Group A

Scales (90 bpm)

Candidates must play each scale **once**. Candidates must use each starting note **at least once**: G, A and B

Group B

Arpeggios (90 bpm)

Candidates must play each arpeggio **once**. Candidates must use each starting note **at least once**: G, A and B

- 1. Major arpeggio
- 2. Minor arpeggio
- 3. Dominant 7th

GRADE 4

Group A

Scales (80 bpm)

- 1. Natural minor
- 2. Minor pentatonic
- 3. Blues

Candidates must perform each of the above scales **once**, making sure to involve three different starting notes from the options: A, B, C and D. (3 in total)

- 1. Major
- 2. Major pentatonic

Candidates must perform both scales **twice**. Once for each starting note: F and Bb. (4 in total)

(7 scales in total)

GRADE 5

Group A

Scales (80 bpm)

Candidates must perform each scale **twice**. Once for each specified fingering.

Each starting note must be used at least once (G, Bb, C and D)

- 1. Major
- 2. Major pentatonic
- 3. Natural minor
- 4. Minor pentatonic
- 5. Blues
- 6. Harmonic minor

(12 scales in total)

Group B

Arpeggios (80 bpm)

Candidates must perform each arpeggio from a different starting note, from the options: A, B, C or D

GRADE 6

Group A

Modes

One octave Tempo: 100 bpm

Candidates must play both modes **twice**, once for each fingering position. Each fingering position should use a different starting note, chosen from the four starting notes E, F, G and A

- 1. Dorian
- 2. Mixolydian

(4 modes in total)

Group B

Scales

Over a 10th/11th (see Grade Book) Tempo: 100 bpm

- 1. G minor pentatonic (5 positions)
- 2. B minor pentatonic (5 positions)

(10 scales in total)

Group C

Arpeggios

One octave Tempo: 100 bpm

Candidates must perform each arpeggio from a different starting note, from the options: E, F, G and A. or D

- 1. Minor7b5
- 2. Diminished

(2 arpeggios in total)

Group D

Chords

Candidates must play both chord types **once**, each using a different starting note of F or G

- 1. Dominant7th
- 2. Minor7th

(2 chords in total)

Group E

Stylistic Study (played to backing track)

Candidates to perform one technical study from the list below:

Example 1 – Rock / Metal: Sixteenth note fingerstyle grooves and legato Example 2 – Funk: Slap and pop playing and percussive 16th note fingerstyle

Example 3 – Jazz/Latin/Blues: Chords and Upper Register playing

















GRADE 7

Group A

Modes

One octave Tempo: 100 bpm

Candidates must perform each mode/scale twice using both specified fingerings, making sure to involve three different starting notes from the given options (F, Bb,D and Eb).

- 1. Lydian (one octave)
- 2. Phrygian (one octave)
- Jazz melodic minor (one octave)

(6 modes in total)

Group B

Scales Two octaves Tempo: 100 bpm

1. G major

Group C

Arpeggios One octave Tempo: 100 bpm

Candidates must perform each arpeggio **once**.

Each arpeggio must be performed starting on a different starting note to the others, from the options of F, Bb, D and Eb

- 1. Major9th
- 2. Minor9th
- 3. Dominant9th

(3 arpeggios in total)

Group D

Chords

Candidates must play all chords from both two starting notes E and A.

- 1. Dominant7th
- 2. Major7th
- 3. Minor7th

(6 chords in total)

Group E

Stylistic Study (played to backing track)

Candidates to perform one technical study from the list below:

Example 1 – Rock / Metal: Pedal tones and legato phrasing

Example 2 – Funk: 16th note slap grooves and string crossing

Example 3 – Jazz/Latin/ Blues: Natural harmonics and arpeggios

















GRADE 8

Group A

Scales One octave Tempo: 100 bpm

Candidates must perform each scale **twice** using both specified fingerings, Each scale must start from a different starting note from the given options F#/Gb. G, C#/Db and G#/Ab on the E string

- 1. Whole tone (one octave)
- 2. Diminished (one octave)
- 3. Altered (one octave)

(6 scales in total)

Group B

Scales Two octaves Tempo: 100 bpm

Exercise 4 in the indicated key only.

4. G natural minor

Group C

Arpeggios One octave Tempo: 100 bpm

Candidates must play all four arpeggios, two from the starting note G, and two from the starting note D.

- 1. Dominant7#5
- 2. Dominant7b5
- 3. Dominant7#9
- 4. Dominant7b9

(4 arpeggios in total)

Group D

Chords

Candidates must play all three chord types, each using a different starting note from the given options F#, G, Db, Ab

- 1. Minor7th
- 2. Major7th
- 3. Dominant7th

(3 chords in total)

Group E

Stylistic Study (played to backing track)

Candidates to perform one technical study from the list below:

Example 1 – Rock / Metal: Odd time grooves and power chords

Example 2 – Funk: Syncopation and slap bass technique

Example 3 – Jazz/Latin/Blues: Up tempo fingerstyle technique and walking basslines
